Divided Tatting Caddy Basket



This is a versatile basket, which is perfect for storing multiple tools and threads. Uses a wooden base for the bottom and handle with a twill weave. Kit charge of \$25 (paid directly to teacher) for the walnut base that forms the divider and bottom of the basket.

Basic Ice Drop



If you're new to tatting Ice Drops, this is the place to start! We will go through the basic pattern step-by-step. Glass gems will be provided. All you need is a shuttle, size 20 thread, and the desire to learn. Optional items to help you out are a picot gauge, a crochet hook for joins, and a tapestry needle for hiding ends.

Tatting Corner Tat Days Ice Drop

**No Picture –
This One's A
Surprise!**

Designed specifically for Tatting Corner Tat Days, this Ice Drop requires two shuttles wound continuous thread method with size 20 thread. Glass gems will be provided. There is one split ring in this pattern. Familiarity with the basic Ice Drop pattern is helpful, but not required. Optional items to help you out are a picot gauge, a crochet hook for joins, and a tapestry needle for hiding ends.

Tiny Rose Buds



We will be making tiny 3D rose buds in this class. Students should bring size 10 or 20 thread in the colors of their choice (more than one color is needed; variegated colors are acceptable as well); crochet hook; scissors; and the materials you use to close and secure your ends.

Wired Hair Wrap



We will be making a Wired Hair Wrap. There will be lots of practice tatting over wire. Knowledge of pearl tatting helpful, but not necessary. If you don't have long hair to wear your wrap on, it can be used as decoration on a taper candle, or maybe a headband. We will be talking about other applications for using tatting on wire.

Twisted Hearts Ornament



This tiny (less than 1 1/2" in diameter) beaded glass ornament is made from two motifs. The second motif is almost like the first – but there is a twist! The tatter will get practice in adding beads to picots and in joining to beaded picots. Supplies: 2 tatting shuttles, size 16 crochet hook, and the usual tatting supplies. There is a required \$3 kit (contains

ornament, hearts, thread, beads, and safety pins, and paid directly to the teacher) – color choice of blue or purple.

Beaded Bloom Pendant



This pattern is rings and chains, with 99 seed beads and one 15mm flat bead for the center. It is done on two shuttles wound continuous. When you finish, you will have a flower that can be attached to a necklace, or you can make more of them to have a bouquet of flowers. Size 10 or 20 thread needed. A crochet hook may be helpful in making joins.

Picot Play Heart



Stocked with plenty of split rings, this heart also has some fun picot techniques. Students should bring 2 shuttles or 1 tatting needle; 1 ball of size 20 tatting thread; and the usual tatting supplies.

Level: Experienced beginner on up (Experienced beginner should know how to do rings and chains)



Strawberry Blossom

This strawberry blossom can grace a summer top, a special box lid, or even framed. Techniques include onion skin joins, lock joins, and a cork screw stem. Students should bring 1 shuttle or 1 tatting needle; size 20 tatting thread in white, pink, yellow, and green; and the usual tatting supplies.

Level: Experienced beginner on up



Bling-it-on Post Earrings

These fun and quick-to-do earrings feature the twisted join and roll tatting. Earrings can be glued to a post or clip-on style earring findings. Students should bring 1 shuttle or 1 tatting needle; metallic tatting thread such as Diamant by DMC, or one of the new Lizbeth metallics; earring findings of your choice; and the usual tatting supplies.

Level: Experienced beginner on up
